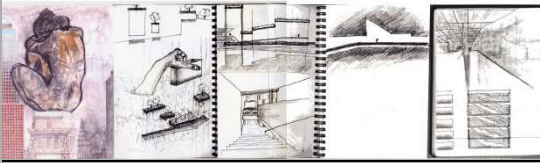

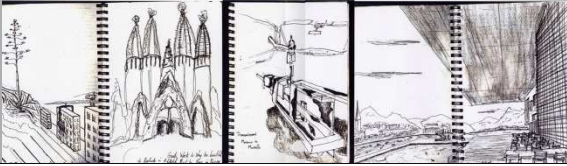

A little bit about myself and the beginning of Lost Sock Symposium. I have a diverse background in aviation, construction, and a life-time passion for snowboarding and skateboarding. Although an unorthodox adventure to Architecture, they have enlightened my decisions and directed me throughout life's experiences. Skateboarding and snowboarding have allowed me to envision the built and natural environment as a canvas on which to create and explore. As a commercial pilot, I developed strong communication skills and worked in an intense team atmosphere. Finally, as a carpenter, I developed problem solving skills, attention to detail, and an appreciation for craftsmanship. These are qualities and attributes that I can personally bring to your project.

My professional experience in Architecture started at Agency for Architecture in Denver, Colorado as a designer/project manager. While working as project manager, I had direct contact with clients, building officials, consultants, and general contractors from schematic design through construction administration. I collaborated with co-workers and accomplished my tasks in an effective manner. As a designer, I have learned that thoughtfulness and intention are guiding principles in my design process. My work ethic and passion towards the Architecture profession are products of my long term desire to contribute to society in a positive and respectful manner.

While completing the Contract Documents for an adaptive re-use residence and gallery project in Denver in 2009, I was laid off due to shrinking economy. Fortunately, the clients hired me short time after to continue designing their residence (stairs, railings, details, materials, etc.). Seeing the opportunity to be continually involved with the project, I sought out to create a design / build collaboration with Chris Genz Design Build (CGDB). As Designer/Project Manager throughout the construction process, I worked closely with the GC and all the trades: coordinating, detailing shop drawings, and managing to complete the project within the constraints of an extremely tight budget. Furthermore, my partner and I constructed two wall installations. Both made from 100% re-used materials; utilizing 2x's from demolition and salvaged scrap acrylic from local suppliers. My passion for Architecture and design/build is exemplified in this project.

This project forged the creation of Lost Sock Symposium, an Art, Architecture, and installation practice. As Architect/Owner of Lost Sock Symposium, I have continued to work and collaborate with other Architects over the past several years completing numerous tenant finish, core & shell, & residential projects while continuing to provide thoughtfulness and intention for each project. Collaborating with Architect, Theodore Schultz has been an inspirational learning experience working on commercial, community driven projects, and instrumental to the development of my professional career. Furthermore, being submersed in the business aspect of Architecture has led to renewed appreciation of balancing Architecture as a business, while still exceeding clients design expectations.
